



POWERPLAY GOLF CHALLENGE TROPHY 2012

Phunaka (9 Hole Course)

The Event Format

The PowerPlay Golf Challenge Trophy is easy golf, under exciting new conditions – once played you will want to play it more and more. It is a 9-hole Stableford Competition, with a surprising new edge to it. On every Green there are two flags – The easy and normal White Flag and the much harder PowerPlay Black Flag. You score double points for net birdie or better when playing to the PowerPlay Flag. Should you go for the easy White Flag it's just normal Stableford points scoring, the kicker is you have to play 3 PowerPlays in your first 8 holes, so you must choose your PowerPlays wisely. **Players must nominate which colour of flag they are going for at each hole, before teeing up.**

On the last hole, it's decision time. A 9th hole PowerPlay birdie or better wins double stableford points and possibly the tournament ... but failure to make Par spells disaster – you lose 3 points for bogey or worse going for the PowerPlay Black Flag on the last and could lose you the tournament.

OK how does it work:

Course Pars - 5 3 5 3 4 4 4 3 5 = 36

You go for White Flag on 1st and get net par, so you score 2 Stableford points. Next hole you go for PowerPlay Golf (PPG) Flag and get net birdie, so you score 6 Stableford points (double the normal 3 Stableford points you would have scored for a net birdie). Third hole you go for PowerPlay Golf (PPG) Flag and get net bogey, as it is not the 9th hole you get the usual 1 Stableford point, and so on and so on as follows:

1st Hole – White Flag, net par, 2 pts 2nd Hole – PPG Flag, net birdie, 6 pts

3rd Hole – PPG Flag, net bogey, 1 pt 4th Hole – White Flag, net par, 2 pts

5th Hole – White Flag, net birdie, 3 pts 6th Hole – White Flag, net bogey, 1 pt

7th Hole – PPG Flag, net eagle 8 pts 8th Hole – White Flag, net par, 2 pts

You have used your three PowerPlays by the 8th Hole and so far have scored 25 pts and now you decide to go for the difficult PPG Flag on the 9th Hole. Scenario a) You get net birdie and get 6 pts, or b) you get net par and score 2 pts or c) you get net bogey and lose 3 pts. Therefore the outcome for being brave is **a) 25+6 = 31 pts, b) 25+2 = 27 pts and c) 25-3 = 22 pts.**
